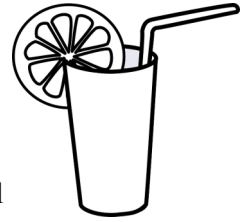

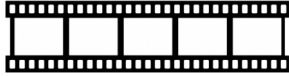


## **Cannabis and a Side of Brownies**
